Southland Championships & Eastern Southland Championships 5 & 6 February 2022

When it comes to clear skies and fine weather, Southland springs to mind. The weather didn't disappoint in Southland over Waitangi weekend. However, this year, the Southland Championships were in Otago. The forecast for Oamaru was heavy rain driving in from the West Coast. The weather pickers were spot-on but for the timing. The heavy rain fell persistently all-day Friday and there was a good deluge overnight but, as luck would have it, the rain ceased for the start of the Championships and it remained fine all weekend.

The wind was fairly tame for most of the day, with the occasional change in strength and direction which was enough to take you firmly into the 4-ring. The biggest challenge came from negotiating the muddy undulations when driving between firing points and perhaps the all-terrain trophy should have gone to Gareth Miller (Ashburton) for his fine off-road manoeuvring.

Indeed, Gareth got off to a cracking start - leading A Grade with two 50s, the second one commencing with 9 Xs and Vs. Chris Kershaw (Malvern) and Bruce Horwood (Invercargill and Ashburton) were hot on his heels. Bruce finished strongest and ended the day on 199 with

Gareth 2nd and Chris 3rd (on countback) just a point behind Bruce but with much healthier centre counts. Martin Fleming handicapped himself by travelling with just one foresight element and, in spite of a nasty snatch early on, adapted well over the course of the weekend to finish strongly.

Oamaru local Robbie Gilchrist led the Grade B shooters from start to finish, whilst John Fleming from Ashburton District Rifle Club sneaked a Grade C win over Malvern's Barry Brown at the final 600 shoot of the day.

Sunday – Day 2 of the Southland Championships

A drier firing point meant less focus on the rally driving and more attention on the shooting. Accordingly, the shooters faired better despite the fickle wind flicking around at 600 yards to spice things up at the finish.

The wind didn't deter Les Grimsey who knows the range all too well. He nailed two 60s to finish. Bruce Plant also got in on the act displaying his experience at 500 yards with a 50 in the TR (Grade C).

Grade A and B shooters were all pretty solid. There were two 149s, two 148s and a 146. Bruce Horwood led the way, producing a carbon copy shoot of Gareth Miller's 50.9 at 500 yards from the previous day (starting with 9 Xs and Vs).

At 600 yards, Horwood was caught on aim to lose one wide out on the right. ¾ minute change and patience was required before firing the next shot and he held on with a 49 to secure the win ahead of the ever-consistent Chris Kershaw.
